Poet, photographer and UW Milwaukee professor, **Kimberly Blaeser** is the current Wisconsin Poet Laureate. Her award winning writing has been widely anthologized and has been translated into several languages. Blaeser's current work Picto-Poems brings her nature photography together with poetry to explore intersecting ideas about Native place, nature, preservation, and spiritual sustenance.



**Cathryn Cofell** of Appleton is the author of Sister Satellite (Cowfeather Press) and six chapbooks. Her work has garnered the Lorine Niedecker Poetry Award and the WI People & Ideas Prize for Poetry, among others. Madison poet laureate (2008-2012), advocate, columnist and educator, **Fabu** celebrates the artistic expressions of women, children, African American, and multicultural communities. Her in depth research into the life and work of jazz pianist Mary Lou Williams culminated in a book of poetry and a theatrical/musical production. She authored poetry books: In Our Own Tongues (University of Nairobi Press), Journey to Wisconsin: African American life in Haiku (Parallel Press) and Poems, Dreams and Roses: poetry for youth and children. She has a traveling exhibit "Poet Fabu in Wisconsin."


John Lehman is the founder of Rosebud Magazine. For years he was literary editor

Nancy Rafal is an advocate of poetry, especially that of Lorine Niedecker. Nancy served as treasurer of the Wisconsin Fellowship of Poets for too many years and is a board member of Friends of Lorine Niedecker. The muse takes her to poetry readings throughout the state and Nancy's work appears in many editions of the Wisconsin Poets' Calendar. Her "if you build it, they will come" project is a 96 foot long mural celebrating Baileys Harbor and Lorine Niedecker. All she has to do is raise the funds.



**Margaret Schroeder** is the founder of The Solitary Plovers, a group dedicated to the living legacy and study of the works of Lorine Niedecker. She continues to coordinate the Plovers and is the warmth behind the Poetry Cafe during the Wisconsin Poetry Festival. She writes occasional poetry and also has a psychotherapy practice in Fort Atkinson.



Marilyn L. Taylor, former Poet Laureate of Wisconsin (2009 and 2010) and of Milwaukee (2004 and 2005), is the author of six collections of poetry. Her award-winning poems and essays have appeared in many anthologies and journals, including Poetry, The American Scholar, and Ted Kooser's "American Life in Poetry" online column. Marilyn taught poetry and poetics for fifteen years at the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee, and currently serves as a board member for several writers' organizations.

Lisa Vihos is the Poetry and Arts Editor at Stoneboat Literary Journal and an occasional



guest blogger for The Best American Poetry. Along with two chapbooks, A Brief History of Mail (Pebblebrook Press, 2011) and The Accidental Present (Finishing Line Press, 2012), her poems have appeared in numerous journals and magazines.
